Tips:

Poems don't have to rhyme.

Try using lots of to do with sound. Here are some ideas.

Bang Clatter Plop Slap Crackle Snap

Squish Bash Gurgle

Sizzle Ring

Hiss Bubble

Pop Thump

Now draw a picture of your meal



You will need:

3 bowls, 1 spoon, lots of bits of paper, a pen or pencil

Take 5 pieces of paper. On each of them, write down a character (person). You can just write their name, but if you can write something about them, too, that will be good. Put the papers into your first bowl.

Take 10 pieces of paper. On each of them, write down a place, real or imaginary. Put these papers in your second bowl.

Take the rest of your pieces of paper and on each of these, write down something interesting to go in your story. This could be an interesting item (for example, a witch's cauldron), or something that could happen (for example, a swordfight). Put them in your third bowl.

Stir the papers with your wooden spoon to mix them up.

Now pick 1 paper from bowl one, 2 from bowl two, 3 from bowl three.

My story is about (bowl 1)

She/he starts in... and ends in.... (bowl 2)

Along the way she/he finds.... (bowl 3)

BONUS STORY IDEAS

You can use food to help you think up characters.

What is your character's favourite food?

What do they hate eating?

Are they allergic to anything?

Imagine your character is at a party and the only thing to eat is the thing they hate. What would they do?

Start a story beginning,

Normally, I am quite ordinary. But when I eat...... I turn into.....

Someone important is coming to tea

Who is your visitor?

What are you going to cook for them?

What happens when they arrive? Do they like your food?

Draw a picture of them in your kitchen.

A Describing Game

Open your kitchen cupboard and take out the first thing you find there. Spend a minute studying it. Pretend you're a detective looking for clues.

Then put the thing away and a write a description of it. Try to include as many details as you can.

This game is fun to do with someone else so you can compare descriptions.
